15	Agenda Item 1, approval of the December 19, 2023
16	meeting minutes. Board Members, you have all received
17	a copy of the December 2023 meeting minutes for your
18	review. Are there any questions or need for a
19	discussion? Okay, hearing none, is there a motion to
20	accept the Board meeting minutes for December 2023?
21	MARTIN DILAN: Board Member Dilan, I make a

CLARISSA RODRIGUEZ: Thank you. All opposed? Hearing no opposition, I am also a yes. Thank you, Board Members. That motion is passed. Agenda Item 2, Office of General Counsel's Departmental Report. General Counsel, Heather MacMaster, will now present the Office of General Counsel's Departmental Report for the month of December.

HEATHER MACMASTER: Good morning, Madam
Chair, Madam Vice Chair, Members of the Board. In
December of 2023, the Office of General Counsel held
15,570 decisions, I mean hearings. The Adjudication
Division resolved 10,084 cases at hearing, and issued
279 Reserve Decisions, 1,784 Waiver Agreements were
also finalized in the Adjudication Division.

1 The Administrative Review Division received 1,080 2 applications for review, they processed 803, and there 3 are currently 6,693 applications pending. 4 And in Legal Affairs, there were 89 Full Board Review applications received, 103 were processed, and 6 there's a current inventory of 2,015 Full Board Review 7 applications pending. Thank you. CLARISSA RODRIGUEZ: Okay. Thank you. 8 9 Board Members, are there any questions or need for a 10 discussion? Okay, hearing none, may I please have a 11 motion to accept the Office of General Counsel's 12 Departmental Report? 13 MARK HIGGINS: Yes, Madam Chair, this is 14 Board Member Mark Higgins, I move to accept the report of the General Counsel. 15 16 CLARISSA RODRIGUEZ: Thank you very much, 17 Board Member Higgins. Thank you for being here today, Juanita, to 13 introduce George. 14 JUANITA PEREZ: Thank you. Good morning, 15 everyone. 16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Good morning. 17 Madam Chair, Madam Vice JUANITA PEREZ: 18 Chair, Board Members. Thank you for providing our 19 team the opportunity to present to you this morning. 20 Again, I'm Juanita Perez, the Deputy Director for the 2.1 Board's Division of Intergovernmental and Regulatory 22 Services. 23 Our division has overall responsibility for 2.4 services provided to internal and external

stakeholders, to include integrated services, data management, and language access. In addition, we advise the Chair and Executive Director on matters of risk management, regulatory compliance, and internal controls. As a side, I hope you enjoyed last year's presentation by our division Senior Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor, Taniqua Hunter.

Today you will hear from our Director of Data

Management and Analytics, George Stolis. George holds
a Bachelor's Degree in Computer Information Systems,
from Sage College. He has been in state service for
24 years, 22 of which have been with the Board behind
the scenes, framing and implementing the many
decisions that have led to the way we currently
collect and assess our data.

George also serves as the data lead for the
OnBoard systems modernization program ensuring we
improve the availability and reliability of Board
system data for the future. As the Director of the
Data Management and Analytics Unit, George has
encouraged his team to produce and assess Board data
in ways that make our information for all stakeholders
more timely, applicable, and efficient.

Last, but not least, George is a very busy person

1	outside of the office, as he is the father of
2	triplets. We are very lucky to have him. George,
3	you're up.

11	today. As Juanita mentioned, my name is George
12	Stolis, I'm the Director of the Data Management and
13	Analytics Team, or DMA for short.
14	Today, I would like to provide you with an
15	overview of what the DMA team does, and how we do it.
16	And hopefully we'll have a few minutes later to
17	discuss further. Sorry. Oh, there is, there are
18	slides to advance. Great.
19	LAURA INGLIS: You can if you want. You can
20	still see it from here, if that's helpful.

22	tell Laura and she'll advance.
23	GEORGE STOLIS: Okay. All right. DMA
24	ensures the right people have access to the right data

to inform their decision-making needs, with an expectation of quality and reliability. Simply put, we compile data, turn it into information, and help to make decisions with it. We are a part of the Office of Intergovernmental and Regulatory Services, and are primarily located here in Schenectady. My team is comprised of a dozen analysts, statisticians, and researchers, who specialize in understanding data.

We help develop and maintain the Board's Data
Warehouse, which is comprised of data from nearly all
four systems. We provide research, data analysis, and
various recurring and on-demand reports, leveraging
the data in the Data Warehouse. We assist Board
leadership with policy-making decisions.

We use data to help identify business process improvement opportunities in the workers' comp system. We enable a broader understanding of the agency's mission and values by using data. We work closely with executive management to develop key strategic metrics to, design to help achieve, the agency achieve its mission. We are currently engaged in the OnBoard program helping to identify data and reporting needs for the future.

DMA provides on demand data analysis and reports

to both internal and external requestors through our data request process. Requests are submitted either directly to DMA staff, or to our data and request mailbox. Requests are evaluated to ensure that the data is available, and that the questions raised can reliably be answered. Requests are then assigned, developed, reviewed, and delivered.

We receive requests of many different kinds. Um we receive requests to research the performance of internal Board programs for decision-making purposes, for analysis of externally published research, and news articles that include information about the Workers' Comp Board, to analyze data and provide insight, to inform policy-making decisions, or to determine the impact of proposed legislation, to create ad hoc reports for internal and external customers, to produce data in response to FOIL requests, to respond to inquiries from members of the media, and in response to subpoenas for jury proceedings.

To give you a sense of the volume of requests we receive, in 2023 DMA handled over 400 total requests.

That's an average of 1.7 requests per day. Not all requests are created equal, some can be handled by one

person in less than an hour. While others may require a team and could take a week or more to complete.

Approximately a third of our requests in 2023 came from members of executive management. Another third came from internal program areas such as Claims Operations, Adjudication, Administrative Review, Finance, Compliance, and Medical Director's Office. Over 70 external requests came through FOIL, press inquiries, or from other public entities, and other state agencies.

DMA is also responsible for helping to produce several periodic reports for the Workers' Compensation Board. Pursuant to Section 153 of the Workers' Comp Law, the Board's Annual Report, published each year on February 1st, details the Board's work in hearing and deciding cases, and related aspects of Board operations. Pursuant to Section 35 of the Workers' Compensation Law, and as part of the 2017 Workers' Comp Reforms, the Board is charged with tracking and reporting annually on all claimants who have been awarded permanent partial disability status.

DMA also produces a suite of dashboards each month for executive management to evaluate internal Board performance. Each week, DMA produces a report

for Chamber that includes keyboard metrics. In accordance with New York State insurance laws, DMA contributes to an annual report published by the appointed public actuary on the impact of the 2017 Workers' Comp Reforms. We also produce an internal monthly report tracking COVID-19 workers' compensation claims.

Each quarter, DMA publishes an anonymized workers' comp claim data to the New York State Open Data Website. These data sets are available to the public, and include information about workers' comp claims assembled since 2000.

The data and reports that DMA produce serve a broader purpose. They provide insight to those who seek information to help them make decisions. There were many instances in 2023 where DMA provided data that helped achieve an important goal.

Here are just a few: On September 6, 2023,
Governor Kathy Hochul signed into law a bill that
increased the minimum benefit rate for permanent and
temporary partial disabilities. DMA worked to
evaluate, evaluated the impact of the proposed
changes. DMA also performed an analysis to evaluate
the impact of proposed bill to modify the Board's

hearing process.

Throughout 2023 DMA produced monthly dashboards for executive management. These dashboards were used to monitor and improve critical processes that serve workers' comp stakeholders. Including the timely processing of mail, timely scheduling of hearings, and the timely resolution of claimed disputes.

The Board's Medical Director's Office is responsible for responding to Level 3 Prior Authorization Requests, or PARs. DMA provided weekly data to the MDO to help them eliminate their backlog of pending PARs that were older than thirty days.

Finally, DMA provided analysis of paper requests for action, RFA-1LC forms, that helped inform the design of the future OnBoard Request For Action electronic form intake process. These are just a few examples of where the DMA team was able to leverage data to help make decisions and improvements.

Since 2012, DMA has helped build and maintain the Board's Data Warehouse, which is an essential database comprised of data from Board application systems like CIS, IC-2, HPA, and Claims, OnBoard Limited Release, and more.

DMA also helps to manage the centralized

reporting platform that the Board, that Board users use to access data in the warehouse. This web-based tool is known as Pentaho. Pentaho allows users to build their own reports, dashboards, and visualizations. Nearly all reports that DMA produce come from the Data Warehouse or from Pentaho. These are two very important tools that provide a single version of the (inaudible) of Board data.

DMA is also looking toward the future. We are working closing with the OnBoard team to identify data and reporting needs for the future system to help ensure a more efficient Board and a more responsive, efficient and effective system. DMA is helping to improve the availability and quality of data to be used for automation and analysis to increase reliability and reduce the chance for errors.

OnBoard will vastly improve our ability to help the Board make decisions with data. And that's something we're very excited about. Thank you all again for the opportunity to speak to you today about the work that Data Management and Analytics team does.
